Brother Knights:

This newsletter brings us through 4 months of the fraternal year and sheds some very disheartening light on the membership

growth in Illinois. After 3 years of consecutive growth, it appears that recruitment efforts have stalled. As of mid October only 303 new members have been recruited as compared to more than 630 in each of the last 2 years. These numbers are the lowest numbers in the last 10 years and show a lack of recruitment efforts for many councils throughout the State. Why have we quit asking fellow Catholics to join us in the ***Experience of a Lifetime***? Why are we unwilling to share our membership with other Catholic men? All we have to do is ask someone to join us. The worst that could happen is they tell us "no". If you keep asking Catholic men to join, some of them will say "yes".

The fall Membership Blitz is underway with Church drives in October, and Open House and First degrees by mid November. Get these prospective members initiated quickly and get them involved in the brotherhood. Find out what their interests are and give their names to the program chairs in their area

of interest. Who knows, that new man you asked to join could become your best friend or a future Grand Knight. You'll never know unless you ask him to join. The State Officers will be contacting the Diocesan Consultants and District Deputies to get the numbers from the Blitzes.

Also to help the recruitment efforts for all our councils we will be posting information on First Degrees on the Illinois website. This has been very successful in the Rockford Diocese with monthly emails for the last 3 years. By posting this information on the website, neighboring councils will be able to bring their candidates to nearby First degrees and not delay getting their members in the Order. Some councils do not have First degree teams and this will help them bring in new members. We all need to work together to bring new men into the order so that our children and grandchildren will be able to participate in future years.

The First Degree ceremonial is changing with some minor modifications. As the new books are printed over the next 2 months, they will be distributed to councils that currently have certified First Degree teams. Other councils that do not have a team can order the books later this year. District deputies will have to

recertify all First Degree teams after they learn the new degree.

The Officers wish to thank the councils for their hard work in raising funds for the MR/LD drive this year. Reports of the drive are due now, and we need to request the funds for the agencies we support. We also wish to thank you for the tremendous response to Hurricane Katrina relief with more than \$30,000 sent in to assist the victims in our southern states by mid October. We are halfway to the \$60,000 council match and it is our hope we will be able to send another \$60,000 to assist after all funds are received by the end of October. Thank You.

Remember to ask someone to join the Order this month. If every council officer were to recruit one man, that is 14 new men for your council. Make a concerted effort to make membership recruitment a priority in your council and you will see a lot of good things happen.

Keep in mind that the monies are collected from the public under the blanket of Charities, Inc. and you are entitled to receive your monies back for the programs that you support. Send your disbursement requests at the same time you send your monies and drive reports. Let all of us be good stewards of the funds and see that the monies are distributed in a timely fashion.

The Financial Secretaries should be preparing to order the new years membership cards so that they can mail out the dues notices in a timely manner and be ready when the dues start a rolling in. And don't forget to order extra cards for all of the new members you will be adding to the order this year.

But we all take notice when disaster strikes large populations as with Hurricanes Katrina and Rita. Our instantaneous media allows us to witness these disasters as they happen. It is almost surreal that we can watch people's lives wash away the moment it happens. But watch we do, and then we react.

The outpouring of support from brother Knights and their families are exactly what we should expect. We saw the damage, the suffering, and we answered the pleas for help. Delinquent Forms & Reports:

Currently the following is furnished:

- 1) Form 185 *Report of Chosen Officers*: 33 councils are delinquent
- 2) Form 365 *Report of Program Personnel*: 140 are delinquent
- 3) DIR1 *Data Gathering Form*: 107 councils are delinquent. Please note that this form is used to compile the State Directory. It shows the Council Grand Knight, Financial Secretary as well as council meeting information.
- 4) Form 1295 *Semi-Annual Audit*: 109 councils are delinquent
- 5) July 1, 2005 State Per Capita: 77 councils are delinquent.

A **SECOND NOTICE** will be mailed out to the appropriate councils.

Reports of the **MR/LD Fund Drive** are beginning to arrive at the State Office. To avoid delays in receiving funds, be sure a copy of the candy order form has been mailed to the State Office; receipts for miscellaneous and advertising expense accompany the report, (along with a copy of the MR/LD ad); and most importantly **BE SURE THE MATH IS CORRECT** and the check is the correct amount.

When requesting the MR/LD funds, please allow us 3-4 weeks to process your request. We try to accommodate the dates on **every** request, however, requests for a shorter turnaround time may not be possible. Don't forget to complete the "Volunteer" section at the bottom of the form.

We are still having some difficulty with mail not coding because we do not have the Post Office Box for some Knights. Some towns do not make home deliveries of mail, and insist that residents maintain a Post Office Box. **WE NEED THAT PO BOX ADDRESS!** You know who you are. Please advise the State Office of that PO Box so you can receive all communication with the State Office, as well as the Supreme Council.

We will be mailing the **Vocation Support Packages** for 2005-2006 shortly.

The Newman Solicitation is at the Supreme Printing Office and will soon be mailed to your address of record. When it arrives and if there is any change in the address, please note it on the distribution card in clear print so we can correct our records and pass it along to Supreme Council.

Finally, if in doubt that a form, donation, report or Request for Distribution has gone astray, please do not hesitate to contact the State Office and we will be happy to assist you. ☺

As of this writing we have presented six of the seven scheduled seminars. The seventh is scheduled for October 29, 2005 in Niles, Illinois. The location is St. John Brebauf Church at 8301 N. Harlem Avenue in the Family Ministry Center. This last seminar will start at 10:00 a.m. and end at 2:00 p.m. Over 200 Brothers will have attended these seminars. The evaluation sheets continue to be at the 97.2 % return rate. Interesting enough 69.3% have rated the seminars as Excellent with many taking the time to write some very encouraging comments! Only six of the attendees to date have had less than positive comments. One of the more common comments was " please take the side-bars outside as they are very distracting". We have taken these comments into consideration and thus have adjusted with regard to the remaining seminars.

The Spring Seminar development is well underway. In keeping with the modified four year initial plan , these seminars will focus on both a religious topic--What does it mean to be a Catholic-and a financial segment which will include the A-Z of Councils financials and why they need to be done this way. It will also discuss the ramifications/legalities /risks if not done the correct way. These two areas will take a minimum of three hours to present-at this point. Fr. Jim is spearheading the religious topic along with Fr. Chuck and deacons. It is the intent to have it all finalized before the January DD meeting. The presenters of the religious topic will be the ordained Academy faculty or their designate. The financial topic will be presented by the non-ordained Academy faculty.

Discussions have already begun relative to the State Convention and the role the Academy has been asked to play. We will have two seminars; similar to last year's very well received format. The insurance group will have one. Thus there will be a total of three. The logistics of such are in the very early stages. Our Worthy State Deputy is providing direction on what will be the content etc.

I would like to take this opportunity to thank all of you for your absolutely great support and constructive advice. Based upon the feedback, both written and orally, it appears that we are on the right track and doing the things that our membership want. People are asking and taking copies of the handouts back with them to share and encourage their members to attend. To me, that is a very good sign and thus I would expect the spring Seminars to be even better attended as the word spreads! Also, I would like to express the Academy's sincerest appreciation and thank you to the Diocesan Leadership teams for their invaluable help and to the Councils who hosted the fall Seminars. A number of attending Councils have volunteered already to host a Spring Seminar and I again see this enthusiasm as a very positive sign!
