Knights:

As I sit here composing this month's newsletter article on Thanksgiving weekend, I have much to be thankful for in my life. All of our children and grandchildren joined us for Thanksgiving dinner as well as my future daughter-in-law and her brother. We had a beautiful day and enjoyed the visit. We are thankful for our health even though we have illness and symptoms of aging occasionally. We are thankful for having a job and supporting our family as best we can when there are some people who struggle daily just to survive. We are also thankful that we are able to help others in their time of need. We are thankful for our Faith and our love of God, who has given us a desire to assist others in need.

As your State Deputy I am also thankful that we responded so generously to the challenge for Hurricane Katrina Relief. As of November 1<sup>st</sup>, the councils in Illinois have donated over \$90,000 to the General Assistance Fund and more than \$12,000 to the Supreme Fund. In

addition, there was another \$26,669 from individuals that live in Illinois who donated to the Supreme Fund. At the November State officers meeting, we approved sending an Additional \$30,000 each to Alabama, Mississippi, and Louisiana for Katrina Relief. There is still a few donations trickling in, and we anticipate this will close by the end of December.

I am also thankful that the MR/LD funds are being turned in so that we can get an idea how we did this year. We should be making some donations to Special Olympics at the mid-winter meeting in Springfield as well. I am thankful the Newman donations are coming in because we have appropriated \$225,000 to the Newman Centers this year and need some of these donations to issue the checks by Christmas. Newman is a program that needs a lot of promotion at the local council level to increase the donations. Several of the Newman Centers throughout the State rely on the Knights of Columbus funds to keep their doors open and offer programs to the students. Please promote it in your council newsletters and church bulletins.

The Vocation Raffle returns have been very slow so far, and are in need of a boost. We have been helping more than 100 seminarians with Christmas

and birthday gifts, sponsoring the Mundelein Shootout, welcome back dinner and various seminary donations. Some of the Mundelein seminarians have asked us to consider obtaining some bicycles to get around campus. Our hope is that this year's raffle will raise \$100,000 for Vocations so we can look at some new programs to help religious vocations. I heard a parish priest talk about priesthood vocations at a recent dinner, and he repeated the same message Bishop Kaffer and many of the State leaders have been saying for the last few years. If we want parish priests in the future, we have to encourage our children, nephews, grandchildren, and other young boys to consider the priestly vocation. **Vocations start at home!** Talk to your family members and friends. We all must do a better job at increasing the number of young men entering the seminary.

While I am very thankful for the works we have done and will do in charity, I am very concerned with the progress that is being made on recruitment of new members. We all apply the lesson of the 1<sup>st</sup> degree very well with our works in charity, but somehow we seem to forget the lessons of the 2<sup>nd</sup> and 3<sup>rd</sup> degrees. Unity of purpose in developing a strong membership in our councils appears to be on the back burner for the first 5 months this fraternal year. We have forgotten to share our fraternal spirit with other Catholic men in our parish families. If we want our councils to be strong and vibrant and to continue to exist for our children and grandchildren, we must ask other men to join our ranks. We need to share our **Experience of a Lifetime** with another catholic man. Lifetime friendships are developed

between Brother Knights; who knows, you may not have met your best friend yet. Sign up a member before Christmas and you may be giving him the best gift he ever received.

In closing, Judy and I wish all of you a Very Blessed Christmas and a Joyous New Year. Make sure you spend some time with your family and friends. Celebrate Christmas with the family attending Mass together and hearing the glorious news that the baby Jesus is born again. God's Love and Peace to all of you this year. Vivat Jesus!

When the checks reach my office they are reviewed, verified, signed and then mailed to you the next morning. We work as fast as we can to get the requests completed and the checks to you as quickly as possible so help us help you by planning ahead.

I am looking forward to a good second half of the fraternal year and I intend to keep the membership monkey off my back by signing up a new member, how about you? Let's all work together to keep our Order in Illinois growing by signing up a New Knight for the New Year.

### **Form 990 and 990AG**

Councils are reminded to complete Form 990 for your Federal Taxes and Form 990 AG [Attorney General] for Illinois State tax requirements. Completion of these forms depends on the amount of income your council receives; however, it is usually advisable to complete Form 990 in all cases even if your income is below \$25,000. In as much as this is a legal requirement, councils should ask their accountant about completing these forms. Also, both Federal and State internal revenue authorities provide assistance with questions on these matters.

Health services chairman and Past State Warden Gary Gunderson has reported that over 745 units of Blood have been donated by Knights of Columbus council blood drives. **Council #9689** Grayslake is leading all councils in Illinois with units donated totaling 221. Have you ever wondered where the word Christmas came from? I have and the following is from the Catholic Encyclopedia:

"The word for Christmas in late Old English is *Cristes Maesse*, the Mass of Christ, first found in 1038, and *Cristes-messe*, in 1131. In Dutch it is *Kerst-misse*, in Latin *Dies Natalis*, whence comes the French *Noël*, and Italian *Il natale*; in German *Weihnachtsfest*, from the preceding sacred vigil. The term *Yule* is of disputed origin. It is unconnected with any word meaning, "wheel". The name in Anglo-Saxon was *geol*, feast: *geola*, the name of a month (cf. Icelandic *iol* a feast in December)."

Confused? It sure does not sound like anything I ever knew. So, trying to come up with an idea for this article, I am again lead back to my upbringing on the South side of Chicago. While perhaps it is ideal for the whole family to attend Mass and to do so regularly-sometimes that just plain is not possible and it was not in my family either.
