As we approach the Mid-year point of the Fraternal Year it is time to make an honest evaluation of where your council is and where it is going. About half the councils have embraced the concept of holding a Blitz Membership Drive and found that it is an effective method of recruiting new members to the Order. The councils that haven't had a monthly recruitment plan are in either a "stagnant or negative state of growth". This is both alarming and very sad as we as Knights of Columbus have committed ourselves to being "the Strong Right Arm of the Church" and the bulwark of helping those in our communities that are most in need. The Pope, Cardinals, Bishops and Priests have singled out the Knights of Columbus as the single most effective force in combating those who seek to remove both Religion and the role of the Family in our society as well as the fight against abortion. Please look at the Monthly Membership Program that can and should be implemented by your council. It is not too late to change the direction of your council.

The latest survey of the 76 Fraternal Societies shows that 95 million hours were performed in service to others. The Knights of Columbus contributed 68 million hours to helping others. This total is more than double that of the other fraternities combined. This is a further example of how important the Knights of Columbus is to our society as a whole and specifically your communities.

Now more than ever it is so important that we ask EVERY Catholic Man to join Our Family to make our Council and our Order stronger and ensuring a bright future for our children.

The Supreme Knight Carl Anderson announced that Pope Benedict XVI is coming to New York and Washington DC in April 08. This is a Great Occasion that will have historical significance. To commemorate this important event the Supreme Council has asked that ALL 1st degrees held this fraternal year will be in honor of the Pope. There will be a commemorative coin given to every recruiter and every new member degreed will be enrolled in a special book that will be given to the Pope by the Supreme Council. This added incentive should encourage every member to step up their efforts to bring in new members to make your councils strong.

The State Council incentive program is ongoing in that for every council that has attained at least 50% of membership goal by January 1, 2008 will be given a free Banquet Ticket to the 2008 State Convention to be held in Lombard during the Memorial Day weekend and councils that achieve 100% of goal by May 1, 2008 will be given another Banquet Ticket to the State Convention. The State Convention is a significant event where I expect every council to earn significant awards in Membership and Programming and the recognition of outstanding councils in the Gold, Silver, Bronze and Honorable Mention categories that every single one of our over 400 councils in the State should be able to attain. This year's State Convention will be both entertaining and exciting. There

will be ore information coming in the upcoming months.

The Knights of Columbus is indeed an "Experience of a Lifetime" but it is all about Family. You belong to your immediate Family. You belong to your Church Family. You are part of your Community. You are a Member of the Knights of Columbus Family and as such you are part of OUR **ONE FAMILY UNDER GOD.**

As we approach the Holy Season of Christmas, let us all remember our families and thank each member of our families for the gifts and joy that each member brings into our lives. They are indeed both precious and special and should never be taken for granted.

The truth of the matter is that there are still people that feel no Cheer feel no joy. Children will go to bed hungry while so many of us will go to bed with too much in our stomachs.

I was reading the below article from our insurance Department and I felt it could be of interest to you.

To help educate consumers about the need for and value of adequate life insurance protection, the Life Insurance Market Research Association (LIMRA) has published the following five facts. These statistics are certainly worth considering.

Fact 1: Nearly three fourths of North Americans agree that life insurance is the best way to protect against premature death of the primary wage earner.

Fact 2: Twenty-four million households have no life insurance protection at all. Almost one third of adults have no life insurance protection.

Fact 3: Forty-four percent of all households don't own life insurance and believe they should, or own life insurance and believe they need more. Among those that already own some life insurance, 40 percent believe they don't have enough.

Fact 4: One fourth of primary wage earners feel they do not have a plan in place to provide a decent standard of living for their family if they died tomorrow. Twelve percent of families would immediately have trouble meeting everyday living expenses and another 15 percent would have difficulty keeping up after several months.

Fact 5: People would like to discuss life insurance with a financial professional. Consumers feel buying life insurance is an important and complex financial decision. Half of them find it difficult to decide how much to buy, and 43 percent worry about making the wrong decision.

Based on the above 5 facts, and assuming our organization falls into the general population we can assume that a majority of our brother Knights either do not have at all or are inadequately covered for life insurance. We'd like to meet with you in your home, at your convenience. We'll work with you to make sure your family is protected. As a brother Knight you can trust. Remember to use the State Website for all state forms. Some may be completed and submitted on line, and others must be completed and printed and mailed. If you feel we have overlooked a form which you feel should be online, please alert the state office and we will strive to correct the oversight.

Fraternal Survey (Form 1728): This is just a reminder that your council's fraternal survey is due at BOTH Supreme and the State Office by **January 31, 2008**. This form is extremely important because the information gathered from this form is used by Supreme to maintain our Non-Profit Status.

Partnership Profile Report with Special Olympics (Form 4584): This form is due at BOTH Supreme and the State Council Office by **January 31, 2008**

General Liability (G/L) Insurance Program: We have had a good response to our new program. Many councils are availing themselves of this broad yet inexpensive coverage. You can obtain a quote by calling the State Council Office. Remember, it is based on your net membership as of April 30, 2007 at a reasonable rate of \$1.70 per member. It will expire June 30, 2008.

Remember when completing your MR/LD Report Form, if you have the new G/L insurance; **DO NOT DEDUCT THE \$30.00 Insurance Fee**. Simply cross it off and continue completing the form. For those councils who have already sent in their form and have the new G/L insurance, and did not do this, the State Council did it for you and added \$30 to "Your Balance to Distribute". Call the State Office to confirm (815-935-2262)

MR/LD: We still have a few councils whose funds are on HOLD from a prior year. These funds need to be cleared and checks issued to the appropriate charities. The councils are: 773, 1026, 1581, 4745, and 13103. Call the State Council Office if you have any questions.

There are also a few councils that have not yet filed their MR report from last year's drive: 1027, 8343, 12911. Please send in your reports as soon as possible.

Spelling Bee information has been mailed to council representatives. If your council would like to participate and has not received a packet, please complete the Spelling Bee Request on the State Website or call the State Council Office and request a packet.

8 steps for a Successful free throw Contest

Follow these 8 steps for insure a successful Free Throw Championship:

Council competition

1. Appoint a Free Throw Chairman now and send me his name, address, and phone no., or e-mail me at ddoddles@aol.com with the Chairman information
2. After a chairman is appointed it will be your Council's responsibility to order Free Throw Championship order forms (FT-KIT from Council's report form booklet) and Submit it to the Fraternal services at Supreme using program's official name; **Knights of Columbus Free Throw Championship**.
3. Reserve a School gym for competition in mid to late January keeping in mind that your District Deputy will be holding a District competition in mid to late February. D.D.'s, order your medallions from Supreme now.
4. Schools may require insurance before this activity may be held. Councils with State Liability are covered. Councils without State Liability insurance will have to prove Insurance
5. Advertisement of this event is a prime factor for participation. Contact schools, put up posters, newspaper articles and specify proof of age is necessary to complete.

6. Recruit volunteers for scoring, and registration of participants (**any 14 year old in High School IHSA Basketball is ineligible to participate due to ISHA by-laws.**)

7. Conduct a competition by the rules covered in the booklet.

8. Present participation certificates to all participants and Council champions certificates at end of competition. Any item or gift given to a participate must not exceed the value of \$20 at any level of competition since that may compromise the amateur status of contestants. Sew on patches may be presented to participants.
