I want to share with you a report from Dave Breen, Vice President of Area Management, Special Olympics Illinois

and our partnership with the just completed Special Olympics Illinois Spring Games

**Knights of Columbus and
Special Olympics Illinois Partnership
Spring Games; April 29, 2011 – May 7, 2011**

Volunteerism: There were 358 Illinois Knights of Columbus members representing 46 Councils that helped in a variety of ways to serve the 9,709 athletes that participated at Spring Games throughout the state in 2011.

Leadership: There were many examples of leadership, especially from volunteers new to Special Olympics. The Knights of Columbus members served as Honor Guards, Hospitality area volunteers, Event Leadership volunteers, Food volunteers, Awards Photographers and Awards Presentation volunteers. They also participated as key volunteers at some of the events like Ed Feeney who worked as a starter on the track, to the crew in Charleston that manned the bullpen again. On March 26 there was a Knight at the Rink event held in cooperation with the Chicago Wolves and Knights of Columbus with all proceeds benefiting Special Olympics Illinois. There will be three Trivia Knight Fundraisers held in 2011 thanks to the support of the Knights. This year we had the first ever Area 13 Spring Games at Lake Zurich High School with 6 members volunteering. I would also like to thank Bill Spainhour, Ed Feeney, Frank Ryan, State Deputy Jim Bednar and all the past and current state officers for the leadership and guidance in making the on-going partnership such a positive experience for our athletes, volunteers and staff.

Sponsorship: The Knights of Columbus, due to a very generous donation of \$100,000 to the Area programs, were Gold Medal Sponsors at each Spring Games. The Knights were recognized through banners which also listed each council as well as the Knights of Columbus logo displayed on each of the volunteer T-Shirts. All members were recognized at the Opening Ceremonies and announcements were made throughout the day regarding the Knights of Columbus generosity. In addition to the sponsorship, the Knights of Columbus still contribute a significant amount locally through donations to the Area programs. In 2010, there were 105 Knights of Columbus councils that contributed an additional \$90,561.63 to the Areas above and beyond the Gold Medal Sponsorship of \$100,000. We are currently tracking well this year with 55 Councils contributing \$48,158.20!

We thank the individual councils for their continued support and leadership in the civic and fraternal arena.

Partnership: Over the past six years of the partnership Special Olympics has been able to serve 57,629 athletes at Knights of Columbus sponsored Spring Games. During that same time frame there have been 294 councils with over 2,498 members represented and documented as volunteers at the 102 Spring Games that have taken place. We are hopeful this has resulted in greater awareness and membership for the Knights of Columbus Councils. We are also hopeful that this great partnership will continue on into the future.

I encourage every brother knight to take the opportunity to get involved and volunteer to serve at a Special Olympics event. There are many opportunities throughout the year.

New officers are being elected in councils all over the state. **Immediately** after the election, complete and send in your **185 form!** Forward the original to Supreme, copy your DD and the State Deputy (c/o the State Office). **You**

do not have to wait until your officers are installed to send in this vital form. If you use email, you will be done with the click of the **SUBMIT** button!

We hope that Assemblies will file their 186 Election of Officer forms in the same manner as a council.

Both councils and assemblies can utilize the website or wait to receive their copy of the **DIR 1 (Directory Gathering Form)**. This form **MUST** be completed and sent to the STATE OFFICE for inclusion in the new directory.

Filing of your 185 (or 186) form with Supreme as soon as officers are elected will trigger the mailing of the "Surge with Service" package for your council. This package contains the information for the new fraternal year.

The State Office will be mailing an ID packet for the 2011-2012 ID Drive. To date, only 114 of the 470 councils have notified the State Office of their new ID Chairman. This means that the ID packets for those 356 unidentified councils will be sent to the Grand Knight of record. Please get your new ID Chairman form to the State Office **Right Away!**

Remember to use the State Website (www.illinoisknights.org) to search for current forms, reports and State news. It is a useful tool that should be consulted to remain up to date with news from around the State. It can also be utilized as a link to the Supreme Website by clicking on the Reports Tab.

Please check desk drawers, desk 'cubbie holes', unopened envelopes and **find those ID checks.** Distribute them immediately! In the case of ID, many organizations are in desperate need of funds since the State of Illinois has cut back on their funding. So many groups need funds right now.

Letters will be sent to all councils whose ID checks are still outstanding. If no response is received advising the action they wish to be taken of these funds from the 2009 and prior drives, they will be cancelled and funds transferred to the ID Home Program.

Councils whose funds are on **HOLD** [refer to the latest REPORT LOG on the website] will be treated in the same manner.

Members worked hard to collect the monies donated to these organizations; it would be a shame if funds were lost

because of forgetfulness or disorganization. **Be sure all of the checks requested by your council have been distributed and cashed.**

These next few months will be a little busy here at the State Office. We are preparing for the DD Installation Meeting in July.

Information for the DD Meeting has been posted on the State Website. The invitations for this Installation will be mailed shortly.

We are still awaiting the premium cost for this year's General Liability policy. As soon as it is received, Renewal Invoices will be prepared and send via email or US mail. Quotations for the General Liability policy will be mailed to those councils who have not participated in the past. Remember our policy covers an unlimited number of events at no additional cost.

One last but very important note: In this next fraternal year in an effort to keep costs low, we will be relying more heavily on email communication. It is important we are given an email address for someone in each council so up to the minute information can be transmitted. **PLEASE** show this information on the 185 form as well as the DIR 1.

We will strive to keep those mailings going to ensure you are all informed and up to date on what's happening in the State Of Illinois, and we'll keep smilin'! ☺
